Our Story



In November 2011, the Variety Boys & Girls Club celebrated the grand opening of its new 28,500 sq. ft. building, replacing the 1949 structure.

The Variety Boys & Girls Club is a trusted nonprofit organization that has served at-risk children of Boyle Heights since 1949. For 68 years, the Club has provided a refuge for children who struggle with real life circumstances of poverty, under-resourced neighborhoods, low educational attainment, gang violence, substance abuse and poor health outcomes.

These are some of the most impoverished kids in some of the toughest neighborhoods and Club Staff works to ensure that our programming meets kids where they are in their cognitive development as well as provides for basic needs (e.g., nutrition) so they are ready to learn. It can be a complex journey to educate these children but the Club believes that all children can learn at high levels if given the opportunity to excel.

Our Mission

The Club's mission is to provide innovative and stimulating academic, leadership and recreational programming in a safe and nurturing environment to the underserved children and families in the historic Boyle Heights community.

Our Strategy

The Club's impact strategy focuses on the three pillars of academic excellence, healthy lifestyles, and development of good character and responsibility for oneself and community.

Our Program Model

The Club uses a holistic approach to provide academic and life skills to its Members. Its tools are a combination of curricula developed, tested and proven to produce positive outcomes by the Boys & Girls Clubs of America (BGCA) such as Power Hour, Torch Club and Keystone. The Club also provides programs developed in-house such as Junior Heroes and Brent's Club, a substance abuse prevention program. Since its inception in the summer of 2013, the Brent's Club membership has grown to 500 members and serves as the model for other Boys & Girls Clubs. Program offerings are rounded out to include technology and media programs, arts and crafts and a variety of athletic activities.

Since 1972, the Club has awarded over \$2.5 million in scholarships for college

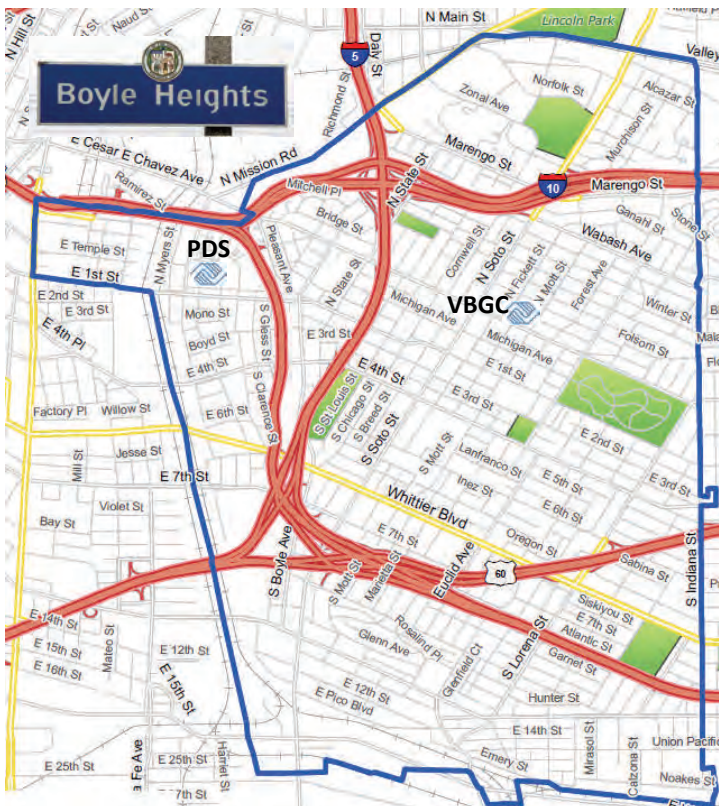
- 78% of Club members in fifth through 12th grades are on track for on-time high school graduation.²
- 69% of Club teen members indicated that they volunteer at least once per year, while 46% said they volunteer at least once per month.²
- 38% Club members ages 12 to 15 report getting the recommended amount of daily physical activity, compared with 25% of youth nationally.²
